

Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles

Dear parishioners,

Today the feast of Saints Peter and Paul outranks the celebration of Sunday. That doesn't happen very often. When you think of what these two men did, however, there is reason to celebrate them.

Here are two guys whose lives got turned around by God. God led them down paths they never dared dream about. Peter was a big strappin' fisherman with a wife and a business thinking that would be how he'd spend his life. Paul was an educated Jew and Roman citizen determined to uphold the Jewish faith. Peter ends up being the first leader of the apostles and therefore head of the brand new Church. Paul gets knocked down and blinded so that he can see his way to being one of the greatest missionaries of the Christian Church and becoming the "Apostle to the Gentiles." Both men ended up with the Christian communities in Rome, and both ended up being martyred there.

Do I have the kind of courage these two men had? Can I trust in God enough to follow where God leads me? Can I see God's hand in the unexpected turns in my life? Do I love God enough to be faithful even if it costs me my life?

When I was a kid in grade school we often talked about the possibility of being missionaries and/or martyrs. I haven't given that much thought in a long time. Do I have that kind of idealism and commitment today?

It's a good day to reflect on how we'd measure up to Peter and Paul. We, after all, also have a purpose in life—God has a purpose for our life.
