Dear parishioners,

Many times when bad things happen, we want to blame God. That's the easy way out. To struggle with the reality of evil is a much more growing approach.

I remember when Matt and Crystal Ellerbrock's little Will died, Matt told me they thought "Why is this happening to us? What have we done to deserve this? Why is God punishing us?" But then they said to each other "That's not the God we believe in." They were able to put their grief in a place where it saved them from despair—and made them stronger, even at so great a price.

It's important that we look at our image of God before bad things happen. God loves us! God is the source of all good! Struggle makes our faith strong.

The gospel today deals with that problem of evil. Can we ever get all evil out of our lives? No. Good and evil will always exist together. This is the condition of "original sin." If we try to destroy all evil, we will destroy the good. Baptism gives us the theological (God-given) gifts of faith, hope, and love. It is God's gift that we are able to see beyond the present moment and bring faith and hope to our life situations.

I just saw the movie "The Fault in Our Stars." In the movie Hazel Grace says that when she was suffering from cancer, she label her pain as 9 because she was saving her 10. When Augustus, someone she loved dearly, died, she used her 10. Hazel Grace could also put her grief in a place where it kept her from despair. She had learned that it is love that gives meaning to our lives.

Thanks, Matt and Crystal, for letting your love for Will be an example to us that in all things, no matter how difficult the struggle, God is good. Your example is like yeast for us.
