Dear parishioners,

If someone ever calls you Jezebel, that's bad, very bad. Jezebel was a Phoenician princess married to the Hebrew king Ahab. She led Ahab out of the practice of the Jewish faith into the worship of the false god Baal. She was also a conniving murderer.

As this story begins, Elijah, the prophet of God, has come through a huge famine. Jezebel has been on a mission to murder God's prophets. Elijah has taken on the challenge of the false prophets—you remember the challenge to the prophets of Baal (450 of them the Book of Kings says) and the prophets of Asherah (400 more) to ask their god to light the fire for the sacrifice. No response. Then Elijah soaks down the whole sacrifice and God lights the fire for Elijah. After all this Elijah is tired to death! He prays to die because he's had enough. Then come this first reading.

God does not come to Elijah in big and powerful ways—not in wind or earthquake or fire. God comes in the gentle sound of a whisper. How much that shows God's comforting love and care for Elijah!

In the gospel the apostles are out in a mighty storm. They are afraid to death. In the midst of the storm Jesus comes to them walking on the water. Now they are even more afraid! Peter recognizes Jesus. When Jesus gets into the boat, the storm settles.

Jesus sometimes challenges us with difficult situations. He is not a powder-puff, feel-good savior. Jesus has some serious challenges for us that stretch our capabilities. We always know, however, that we have been loved into being and God's love is forever faithful. We do not need to be afraid.

Let's be attentive to God's call in our lives—the call to challenge and the call to security.
