Dear parishioners,

I personally knew nothing of the history of Divine Mercy Sunday. I share some of my findings here with you.

On the Second Sunday of Easter of the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass for the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska, Pope John Paul II proclaimed to the world that "from now on throughout the Church this Sunday will be called Divine Mercy Sunday." Pope John Paul had actively promoted the message of St. Faustina: "People will never know peace until they trust the mercy of God."

Helena Kowalska was born in Poland on August 25, 1905. She was the third child of a devout Catholic family. As a small child she reported seeing bright lights during her night prayers. At age 16 she went to work as a servant in a neighboring city. She soon resigned after a fainting spell, even though a doctor said she was healthy. Helena told her parents that she wanted to enter religious life but failed to obtain her father's permission because he felt she was too young. She took a post as a servant and made friends with a circle of young women. At a dance, she experienced a vision of Christ suffering that touched her conscience and revived her desire to be a nun.

In 1925, she entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, taking the name Faustina. She served as a cook, gardener and doorkeeper in Krakow and several other community convents. On February 22, 1931, Sister Faustina experienced a new and life-changing vision of Christ. She saw him wearing a white robe and raising his right hand in blessing with his left hand resting on his heart from which flowed two rays of light. Jesus told her, "Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the prayer, Jesus, I trust in you."

## Items needed for the Bluffton Food Pantry

We will be collecting the following items for the next two weekends, April 9 and 10 and again April 16 and 17, 2016 for the food pantry. Lotions and creams, toilet paper, feminine hygiene products, paper towels, boxes of tissues, deodorant, shampoo, toothpaste, liquid hand soap, canned fruits (especially mandarin oranges, peaches, pears, and applesauce), canned vegetables (No corn or green beans, please - there are plenty in the pantry), baked beans, chili beans and tomato sauce, (Not needed: garbanzo beans, navy beans, cannellini beans, pinto beans, and black beans - there are plenty in the pantry supply), chunky soups such as Progresso, Our Family, or Campbells Chunky (No water added soups are needed at this time - Campbells, etc.), Spaghettios and similar canned items, noodles and broth, spaghetti and spaghetti sauces, Hamburger helper, Tuna helper, tuna (No macaroni and cheese, macaroni noodles, or Ramen noodles are needed at this time.), taco mixes, shells, puddings, jellos, cake mixes, frostings, crackers, cookies, cereal, oatmeal and similar breakfast foods, breakfast pop-ups, pancake mix and syrup, canned meats - chicken, pork, and beef.
