The theme of all the readings is to keep things in the right perspective. Don't put all your energy into worldly success and security. It is much, much more important to look to eternity, to work to tend our relationships with God and with each other, to treat others as God would have us do, to do those works that have value in God's eyes. We've heard and known these admonitions all our lives. Why is it so difficult to keep our eyes on the goal?

I believe our number one opponent in this effort is our culture. We are fed a line hundreds of times a day that what matters is how you look, what you wear, what kind of house you have, what kind of car you have.... People all around us make decisions, not out of concern for the common good, but out of concern for personal comfort or avoidance of personal loss.

What would our world be like if we "put to death" our constant condemnation of our leaders, our public servants, and our neighbor? What if we had an attitude of gratitude about their service and gave constructive criticism to them rather than about them? What would our world be like if we truly believed in Jesus? If we put aside our fear and suspicion and trusted in Jesus' victory over sin and evil? Would that make everything better by tomorrow? No. As Father John said in a homily: Jesus didn't take away sin and death. He overcame it. He gave it meaning. He gave us eternal purpose.

I know two things. I can do better at what I preach, and being the person I want the world to be will make a difference!
