Dear parishioners,

Speaking/Hearing the truth in a difficult situation is never an easy job. Somehow we think that if we oppose what we don't want to hear, it won't be true.

Jeremiah was a prophet chosen by God. The Israelites had turned to false gods and no longer followed God's direction. Jeremiah had the job of telling them that the Babylonians would overtake their city and take them captive if they didn't turn back to God. In response to Jeremiah's warning they threw him into a cistern of mud to try to kill him. Only the courage of one brave man saves his life.

In the gospel Jesus also tells us that following in his way will set us against people. Often we get caught up in the culture and resist being challenged. We want to be just like everybody around us. We don't want to stand out. Look at how many "good Catholics" in surveys say abortion, capital punishment or euthanasia are acceptable, how many young couples choose a "site wedding" or live together before marriage instead of doing what is right. See how many of the earth's resources are wasted and buried in a landfill simply because the kitchen or bathroom isn't stylish by culture's standards.

We also have been chosen by God to speak for and to live what is right and just. It takes courage to be different for God's sake—to do what God commands.
