Dear parishioners,

Today we have big readings about mercy. Mercy means to be spared punishment when we deserve it. In our reading there are three people/groups of people who are shown mercy.

In the reading from Exodus we hear told the story of God having just led the Israelites out of Egypt by the miraculous parting of the Red Sea. Their thanks is to make an idol. They worship a thing they have made with their own hands. God's wrath blazes up against them for this insult. Moses intercedes for them and God spares them the punishment they so richly deserve.

Paul tells us that he surely deserved punishment for persecuting and killing the early Christians. God showed him mercy and used him to become a great apostle to the gentiles.

In the gospel we hear the story of the son who wished his father dead so he could have his inheritance and then squandered all he had received. His brother is not open to showing mercy, but his father is extravagant with mercy. He deals out not punishment, only welcome and love.

Pope Francis tells us in this Year of Mercy that we cannot give mercy unless we first recognize how we have received it ourselves. It's a good day to remember all the times we have deserved to be punished and were not.
