Dear parishioners,

I read an article in “Woman’s Day” this week that told the story of a woman who had ALS, decided she didn’t want to deal with the struggle, moved to Oregon (the first state to “legalize” euthanasia), gathered her family and her favorite things, and took the death-dealing drugs. The article was surrounded with pretty flowers and happy pictures. It promoted and glorified her choice! I found it very, very upsetting.

There was a little box that gave the religious belief—even citing the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops—that we do not have the right to take any life, including our own.

Today we hear the story of the Samaritan woman to whom Jesus revealed everything she had ever done. It makes me wonder how many times we as a nation need someone to show us what we are doing. We look to popular opinion or customer satisfaction or our own preferences to make our choices. We promote comfort and convenience. Have you noticed how much of our media is about opinion polls—as if they matter? Do we really choose what God is asking of us? Do we honor and reverence God’s gift of life to us and to all our brothers and sisters?

We are surrounded by death-dealing choices. The Holy Father has called ours a “culture of death.” Over time we have become numb to abortion, capital punishment, neglect of the poor, deportation of refugees fleeing violence. Will euthanasia be next? Let’s ask Jesus to show us clearly the path we are traveling.
