Dear parishioners,

Because we have been blessed over the past years to have Elect preparing for baptism, we have heard this gospel every year. It never grows old.

The man has been born blind. He has never seen the light of day. Like so many of us, the disciples want to know: What did this guy do? What did his parents do to deserve this? Jesus doesn't explain it. It's nobody's fault. Bad things just happen. It's part of the human condition. God, however, can use it for good.

You will notice in the story that the man born blind believes that Jesus can and did cure him. He is the one who can see. The religious leaders who are so intent upon trapping Jesus and following their own agenda are the ones who are blind. They refuse to open their eyes and their hearts to the absolutely obvious. "He was blind, but now he sees." The religious leaders ask and ask again to see if there isn't someone who will corroborate their story.

Today in the Scrutiny we again ask that we might be shown what it is that still keeps us from following Jesus in the way that truly serves God.

If we ask Jesus today to help us to see, we need to be open to actually seeing. Sometimes we don't like what we have to see.
