Dear parishioners,

The story of Emmaus is one of my favorites! I had always thought the disciples were on their way to Emmaus to preach. Then I found out that they were leaving town in utter disappointment. The one they thought was the Messiah had been killed. Their hopes were dashed. They felt duped.

Jesus appears on the scene and they don't recognize him. He explains the whole Scripture to them as it applies to the Messiah—the suffering servant. He breaks bread with them, and they recognize him in the breaking of the bread and remember that their hearts were burning the whole time he was with them.

Sometimes we come to church that way—wanting to get away because we are disappointed about something. We listen to the Scriptures at Mass, and sometimes we hear exactly what we need to hear. Jesus is always with us, and sometimes we don't recognize his presence. Always in the Eucharist we know he is with us. He has told us what appears to be bread and wine is really him. “He renews our drooping spirit.” What is important is that we bring faith.

The apostles had walked with Jesus through his public ministry. They knew the person he was—loving, caring, faithful, forgiving, and encouraging. That is why their hearts were burning within them. They knew him by faith even when their eyes failed them.

**Our Lady of Consolation Shrine, Carey, Ohio** will offer a Mass for Victims of Cancer on Friday, May 5th at 7:00 pm. We welcome all to come and pray together. Following Mass, visitors are invited to participate in special prayers for healing.

**We will be taking up a special collection for the Trinity Dome at America's Catholic Church** on May 13-14, 2017. During the 2015 General Assembly of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, membership voted in favor of a national collection in 2017 to support the work on the Trinity Dome at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. Every stone and artistic nuance of the Basilica proclaims our nation's relationship with Mary, a spiritual bond formalized in 1847 when Pope Pius IX proclaimed Mary as "Patroness of the United States" under her title of **the Immaculate Conception**.

The Trinity Dome is the central and largest dome of the National Shrine. This "Crowning Jewel" will be adorned in mosaic according to the original iconographic scheme of the Great Upper Church and will depict the Most Holy Trinity, the Blessed Virgin Mary as the Immaculate Conception, and a procession of saints who have an association with the United States and the National Shrine. The procession of saints includes, among others, St. Juan Diego (the first canonized male Native American), St. Kateri Tekakwitha (the first canonized female Native American), St. Teresa of Calcutta (an honorary American citizen), St. Francis Cabrini, M.S.C. (the first U.S. citizen to be canonized), St. John Paul II (the first pope to visit the National Shrine), and St. Junipero Serra (declared a saint by Pope Francis at the National Shrine in 2015 for the first canonization ever to take place on American soil). The Nicene Creed will encircle the base of the dome, while the dome's four pendentives will feature the four Evangelists: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
