Dear parishioners,

The line that most struck me today in the readings comes from the reading from the Acts of the Apostles. Peter has pointed out to the Israelites that they crucified the Lord and Christ. Then it says, "Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and they asked Peter and the other apostles, 'What are we to do, my brothers?'"

Every time we say the Nicene Creed or the Apostles' Creed we say that we believe in the forgiveness of sins. Have you given any thought to how seriously you take that?

Many times what we find most difficult is forgiving ourselves. We seem not to let go of the wrong we have done. We are embarrassed by the decision we made or the action we let ourselves get caught in. Some folks stop going to Mass because they don't believe God can forgive them. All this gives us reason to consider if we really believe in the forgiveness of sins.

Peter tells the Israelites "Repent." There's the kicker. We have to own our sin. We have to stop finding excuses or rationalizing. And we have to turn our life around and not sin again. We also need to make amends where we can—undo the gossip, repair the injury, replace what we have destroyed....

Believing in forgiveness is not to be taken lightly. It is a wondrous gift and a large obligation. Know that the Good Shepherd is always open to giving and teaching forgiveness.
