Dear parishioners,

Next Sunday we begin again the journey of rites that welcomes a person into full membership in the Catholic Church. We will be celebrating the Rite of Welcome with Britny Zwiebel. She is already baptized so she is a candidate rather than a catechumen. At Easter she will make a profession of faith, will celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation, and will make her First Communion.

I never cease to be humbled and amazed at God's work in the hearts of those who walk the RCIA journey. Every person's story is different. Everyone is inspired in a different way. Almost always the inspiration is a person who sets a compelling example or who was at home talking about faith or who cared enough to invite the catechumen/candidate into the Church.

Another common characteristic among the candidates is their openness to hear and follow their heart. I also admire them because stepping up to begin this journey takes some courage.

Becoming a member of the Church is not a solitary endeavor. A candidate becomes part of a community. He/She cannot do that alone. There has to be a community that is open to receive and welcome, to encourage, and to show the way.

Sunday's rite will not be a celebration for Britny alone. It will also be a celebration for each of us—for the grace of blessing us with another member in our faith family, for the call to reach out to and welcome Britny.

Let's give thanks to God for the goodness and grace shown to us.
